CABRAMATTA MOON FESTIVAL CANCELLED

The 2021 Cabramatta Moon Festival has been officially cancelled due to the extension of the COVID-19 lockdown until the end of September.

The traditional harvest festival was scheduled for 19 September.

Fairfield City Mayor Frank Carbone said that the event could not go ahead under current government restrictions.

“Following the Government’s recent announcement that the lockdown in Greater Sydney would be extended until the end of September, Council had no other choice than to cancel the event,” Mayor Carbone said.

“I know everyone is currently facing a difficult time, but I want to acknowledge the great effort you are putting in to ensure we can get out of lockdown as soon as possible, and come together to celebrate as a community once again.

“Council has focused its current efforts on working hard to provide support to the community impacted by COVID – from deliveries of food to helping people connect with local services. We also continue to advocate for more vaccination hubs and more choice of vaccine in Fairfield.”

“I urge the community to continue to do the right thing to stop the spread of COVID-19 – stay home, get tested, and get vaccinated.”

“I look forward to welcoming everyone back to Cabramatta for a bigger and brighter Cabramatta Moon Festival in 2022.”
