PROTECTING OUR PEOPLE DURING COVID-19



Dear residents,

Council is setting up the Mayor's Wellbeing Register to help those most in need in our community, during these challenging times.

The register is designed to assist those who are isolated and would require help to care for themselves during the COVID-19 pandemic.

If you don't have family, friends or community services to rely on, we encourage you to register yourself so we can assist you if the need arises.

If you are over 60 years old; a single parent caring for children and have no one you can call on if you become ill; have a disability with no carer; or if you are someone who is considered to be vulnerable without assistance, we also ask you to register for support in case it's required.

We also ask if you are an informal carer for someone in your family who is isolated or vulnerable, and you don't live with them, please register on their behalf in case more organised support is needed.

Given the size of our population it is important that this register is used for people who do not access any other form of assistance.

Register now by calling 9725 0222.

This register and your details will be kept confidential and will only be used to assist and connect those most in need in our community if the need arises.

Council is partnering with other government agencies such as NSW Police and NSW Health, and our focus is to assist those most vulnerable in our community.

Council will also be undertaking a volunteer drive to help residents in their time of need. We will be in touch with more information on how volunteers can register.

These are times when as a community, we need to come together to lend a helping hand to those most in need. We ask that you continue to connect with each other and check in with your neighbours and those most in need in the community. We are all in this together.
