Listed below are useful links to websites for data and statistics on a range of topics with step-by-step instructions to find the data you need.



### Community Profile [profile.id.com.au/fairfield](https://profile.id.com.au/fairfield)

The Fairfield City Community Profile provides demographic analysis for Fairfield City and smaller areas within it from 2021 Census data. You can view data about age, households and housing, education, ethnicity, health, work and income.

- Go to **<https://profile.id.com.au/fairfield>**
- Select a topic from the options in the left-hand column
- Select from Fairfield City, or a suburb to display data
- You can change the benchmark area – choose from another suburb, Liverpool City, Greater Sydney, NSW or Australia
- You can change the comparison year – choose from 2001 to 2016



### Crime [bocsar.nsw.gov.au](https://bocsar.nsw.gov.au)

NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research website provides objective, and accessible evidence and information to inform public and government decision-making about crime and justice. You can search crime statistics by LGA or suburb and compare them with NSW trends.

  - Click on Statistics and Dashboards
  - Click on Crime and Policing
  - Scroll down and select Local tools: Crime Statistics by LGA
  - Select your location e.g. Fairfield LGA and open the spreadsheet for information on crime by type, year, 2 and 5 year trends and LGA rankings

Health Stats NSW provides useful population health information. Explore data by topic or location. Benchmark against other LGAs or NSW. Access existing data reports on various topics.

- Go to **[health.nsw.gov.au/hsnsw/](https://health.nsw.gov.au/hsnsw/)**
  - Scroll down and click on Explore Locations
  - Click on LGAs and choose Fairfield
  - Choose the topic you are interested in
  - Use the menu on the left to compare Fairfield to other LGAs and NSW
  - You can choose to view the data as graphs, charts, tables or maps.

The AIHW provides useful statistics and info about the health of Australians. Reports and data analysis is available on over 130 topics.

- Click on a topic and select the data to view
- Under Featured click on Australia's Health Performance to see the health of our population and health system

PHIDU provides Social Health Atlases for all LGAs in Australia. You can find data such as homelessness, health status, use of health services and emergency department presentations.

- Click on NSW/ACT
- Download a spreadsheet with data for NSW LGAs



## Australian Early Development Census

Every 3 years the federal Department of Education (in partnership with various research institutes) surveys teachers of children in their first year of school. Data collected shows children's vulnerabilities across several domains including Physical, Social, Emotional, Language and Communication.

- Go to **[aedc.gov.au/](http://aedc.gov.au/)**
- Click on Community Data Explorer
- Enter Fairfield LGA or a suburb, the year, and the comparison year you want to compare with to see trends
- You can see results for vulnerable, at risk or on track children. You can view them in a graph, map or table
- If you click on Additional Data Products you can download a spreadsheet with data for all LGAs, years and domains
