Submissions open Monday 27 March and close Sunday 25 June 2023. The Capture Fairfield competition is open to residents of Fairfield City and students who attend a school within the Fairfield Local Government Area.

CAPTURE FAIRFIELD VISUAL ARTS EXHIBITION

The shortlisted artworks will be on exhibition at Council’s Administration Centre from 26 July to 2 October 2023. The winning artworks will be published in the local newspaper, on Council’s social media and in various Council publications.

WHO CAN ENTER?

Entry is open to residents of Fairfield City and students who attend a school within the Fairfield Local Government Area.

HOW TO ENTER

Please read the entry conditions before submitting.

ENTRY IS A THREE STEP PROCESS

1. Visit Fairfield City Council’s website www.fairfieldcity.nsw.gov.au/capturefairfield
2. Complete the online entry form
3. Upload a photograph of your artwork (video art must be provided on USB).
(If shortlisted, you will be asked to deliver your artwork for judging)

ELIGIBILITY

- All artworks submitted must be the artist’s own
- Fairfield City Council staff are NOT eligible to enter
- The artist agrees that Fairfield City Council reserves the right to take photographs of the artworks for future publicity/promotion.

INSURANCE

- Insurance for artworks whilst in transit is the artist's responsibility
- All care will be taken by Fairfield City Council to safeguard the works whilst exhibited on site; however, Council is not liable for any damage to the works.

ARTWORK REQUIREMENTS

All artworks submitted must meet the criteria and artwork requirements.

Any 2D, 3D and digital art will be accepted. Please note:

- Entries shall not exceed 100cm x 100cm in dimension and 5kg in weight, inclusive of framing. Works must fit within these dimensions. Works above this size will not be judged or exhibited
- Video art must be no longer than 5 minutes in duration, in landscape, MP4 format, and provided on USB
- If your artwork contains people who can be identified, you will need to submit a photography and video consent form (available on Council's website) for each person. If the person is under the age of 18, a parent or guardian is required to sign the photography and video consent form on their behalf.
- Artists are required to upload a digital image of their artwork in JPEG format at 300dpi upon registering.

WASTE TO ART REQUIREMENTS

Recycled art is creative work made from discarded materials that once had another purpose. This includes anything from cardboard packaging to scraps of clothing and items found in our natural environment. Artists are encouraged to reclaim items which would have gone to waste to create something new.

Waste to Art Entry Conditions (primary students)

- The entry is a combined effort by a class of Year 3-6 primary school students
- The primary school must be in the Fairfield Local Government Area
- The artwork must be made from clean, used items that would otherwise be considered as 'waste', this includes items found in nature.

Examples:

Fabrics	Used clothing and offcuts.
Cardboard	Egg cartons, boxes, and packaging.
Plastics	Straws, bags, CD's, containers, toys, bottles, cups, and lids.
Natural environment	Twigs, rocks, and leaves.
Metals	Bolts, tins, cans, and utensils.

- The items selected should contribute to the story and message that you choose to convey
- Non-waste products can only be used for assembling the work e.g., binding, bonding, and adhering
- Final artwork must be able to be disassembled into individual components to be correctly disposed of after the competition, if necessary.
- Can be two or three dimensional e.g., sculpture, collage, or functional piece you can wear
- Restricted to be no larger than 150cm in height, width, or depth.
- Three-dimensional works should be free standing or wall mounted with instructions on assembly if required. Artworks cannot exceed 10kg.

Waste to Art - Repurpose Suburb Banners

Give our banners a new life!

You may have seen our big colourful banners around the City promoting our wonderful events and programs. We want you to get creative and find what we can repurpose them into after their life as a banner is over!

Enter our new Capture Fairfield Waste to Art competition, where there are some great prizes for the most creative and practical entries.

Entries are open to secondary students and adults. We provide the material for you to use for your entry.

- Secondary students must reside and/or attend a school located in the Fairfield Local Government Area.
- Adults must reside in the Fairfield Local Government Area.
- The artwork must be made from Fairfield City suburb banners which will be provided by Council on request.
- Suburb banners can be manipulated in any way to form a creative work or practical item.

Most Creative category

Repurpose Council's suburb banners into a piece of artwork.

Examples: an article of clothing, wall hanging or sculpture.

Most Practical category

Repurpose Council's suburb banners into an item that is practical.

Examples: a tote bag, shopping bag, zippered pencil case or storage bag, clothing, cushion, throw, patchwork, shade cloth, play tent for children.

SHORTLISTED ENTRIES

You will be contacted if your submission is shortlisted and will be required to deliver your artwork to the Council Administration Centre ensuring that the following requirements are met;

- IDENTIFICATION - Each artwork must be accompanied by the artist's name, address, contact number and title of work
- If two dimensional artworks are presented framed, the artist is required to provide suitable hanging devices (no eye hooks)
- Three dimensional artworks must be suitable for easy installation by one person. Works must not be heavier than 5kg and must be safe and robust to withstand movement
- Include installation instructions with the artwork if required
- All shortlisted entries must be able to be safely handled by one person. It must not cause a hazard to the handler based on weight or the use of dangerous materials. An entry deemed by Council to be a hazard on the grounds of current Health and Safety legislation will not be accepted, judged, or exhibited
- All artworks must be stable and safe in their construction to minimise any damage during handling

WINNING ENTRIES AND JUDGING

- The winners will be announced at the Council Meeting on Tuesday 25 July 2023.

JUDGING

- The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

EXHIBITION OF WORKS

- All shortlisted artworks will be publicly exhibited at Fairfield City Council Administration Centre from Wednesday 26 July 2023, open Monday to Friday 8.30am to 4.30pm.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- The Promoter is Fairfield City Council. Australian Business Number 83 140 439 239
- Participation in this promotion is deemed acceptance of these Terms and Conditions and any entry not complying with these Terms and Conditions is invalid
- Entry is open to residents of Fairfield City and students who attend a school within the Fairfield Local Government Area. Any entrant under the age of 18 years must have their parent or guardian's permission to enter the promotion
- Any entrant under the age of 18 years must have their parent or guardian's permission to enter the promotion
- Elected Members, Officers and Employees of the Promoter, Fairfield City Council, and their immediate families, are ineligible to enter. For the purposes of these Terms and Conditions, "immediate family" means any of the following: spouse, parent, or child
- Entrants are organised into three groups as at 1 January 2023: **Primary School Aged Student, Secondary School Aged Student** and **Adult** (18+ years)
- If An individual Primary School Student or Secondary School Student winner attends a school located in the Fairfield Local Government Area, the student's school will receive \$200 in prize money (with a maximum of \$200 awarded to any one school)
- Fairfield City Council (and Council authorised third parties) reserve the right to use photographs of the artworks for various media formats including, but not limited to, print media, including Council publications advertisements, calendar, websites, social media, and other digital mediums, and for exhibition purposes
- Entrants will be credited during the exhibition, and if the artwork is reproduced at any time
- If for any reason this promotion is not capable of running as planned, whether caused by infection by computer virus, mobile phone failure, line drop out, bugs, tampering, unauthorised intervention, fraud, technical failures, or any other cause beyond the control of the Promoter which corrupt or affect the administration, security, fairness or integrity of the Promotion, the Promoter reserves the right in its sole discretion, to cancel, terminate, modify, or suspend the Promotion. The Promoter may in its sole discretion disqualify any individual who tampers with the entry process
- The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into
- Finalists will be contacted by Friday 30 June 2023
- Total prize pool for the Visual Arts promotion is \$5800.
- The Promoter retains the absolute discretion to require a winner to provide Photo ID before awarding the prize
- The winning artworks are non-acquisitive.
