

Proportion of residents born overseas in a non-English speaking country, 2011


- Australia 16.4%

■ Fairfield 50.1% = 94,022 people









### Language other than English spoken at home


Proportion of residents who speak a language other than English at home, 2011

■ Fairfield 69.9% = 131,164 people




### Language other than English spoken at home

36 languages spoken at home by more than 200 people living Fairfield 47% of all Assyrian/Aramaic speakers in Australia were in Fairfield (14,656)











#### Arrived between 2006-2011




Proportion of overseas-born residents who arrived in Australia between 2006 and 2011


- Australia 21.7%

#### Birthplace of arrivals between 2006 and 2011








#### Changing face of Fairfield's overseas born pop
















## Age of recent migrants





2011-2016 arrivals (Fairfield) 1,455 (22% of total intake)


Very small migrant group compared to the size of others in Australia and Fairfield




#### Concentrated in NSW







Syrian-born population, 2011




#### Syrians in Australia

**>** 

- Over 50% Christian religions, 35% Muslim
- Relatively high education levels (14% have a degree, compared to 18.8% nationally)
- Older than other migrant groups (peak ages 40-50s) and fewer children
- This may change with the new wave of migrants coming in




#### Effect of refugees on society



- Important part of Australia's migration story
- Often very driven and loyal to their new country
- Need support initially, but work hard and contribute alot to the economy in future years
- Refugees are more likely than any other migrant category to start their own business (ABS, 2016)
- Provide a cushion against the ageing population and invigorate our aging workforce
- Contribute to our strong multicultural community
