2023 will be one of the biggest years yet for Fairfield City as we build upon the success of 2022 and deliver more exciting projects, services and events for everyone.

This financial year we are investing \$61.4 million in infrastructure and will continue with our program of improvements committing more than \$25.7 million on upgrades to parks, footpaths and roads throughout our City.

Two key projects now underway are the significant upgrades to Bareena Park, Canley Vale and Fairfield Heights Park playgrounds thanks to a \$4 million grant from the Public

Families will soon have new super parks to enjoy getting active together.

Work is underway upgrading Bareena Park, Canley Vale and Fairfield Heights Park playgrounds thanks to a \$4 million grant from the NSW Government.

Bareena Park will comprise a large koi fish slide and climbing rope feature to go with a 'water theme' playground while Fairfield Heights Park will be a 'nature theme' playground with a landmark large treehouse piece.

In addition, Carrawood Park, Carramar will be upgraded and feature the big bass playground. Work is due to be completed by the middle of this year.

NUTRITIOUS COOK-BOOK NOW AVAILABLE
