DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE

Domestic and family violence is violent, abusive or intimidating behaviour in a relationship. The perpetrator uses violence to control and dominate the other person. It can include:

- Verbal abuse
- Emotional abuse
- Physical abuse
- Social abuse
- Financial abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Harassment from stalking

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence happens in all kinds of relationships, including:

- Intimate: partners, lovers, husband and wife, expartners
- Older people and their children (elder abuse)
- Other family members, including step-parents
- People with disabilities and their carers

FAMILY VIOLENCE

Family violence describes a broad range of violent, threatening, coercive or controlling behaviours most commonly used by men against women. The term reflects the diversity of women and children, their experiences and the impact of family violence on the community.

HOW TO OFFER SUPPORT

When discussing different services and family violence support with a client, approach the conversation in a way that:

- Respects their identity and unique situation (including their culture, family structure, and level of risk)
- Meets their specific needs
- Acknowledges the efforts they have made to prevent or minimise harm that they or their child have experienced
- Is non-judgemental and leaves the door open to access services in the future
