Electing a new council

Activity: students to complete a brief description of the four main stages in an election.

Campaign poster

Activity: students to create their own campaign poster.

Teacher preparation:

- Provide the students with an A3 sized paper to create their own campaign poster
- Encourage them to come up with their own campaign slogan
- Teacher to select one student from each class to run for Mayor

Campaign speech


Activity: Students to write a short speech (1 minute) to convince the local community to vote them. Students to present their speech in class and the teacher selects one student (from each class) to run for Mayor.

Vote for student Mayor

The students who were selected by their teacher will now present their campaign speech to all students in the grade. Each student will then vote for their preferred Student Mayor based on their campaign speech. The students running for Mayor can also vote.

Teacher preparation:

- Vote Lanyards to be placed on each student running for Student Mayor with their names
- Set up of tables with pencils and voting papers for students to complete
- Ballet boxes for students to place their votes



Council meeting roleplay

Activity: Students to participate in a Council meeting roleplay.

Teacher preparation

- If possible, set up in one room to cater for all students from the grade who participated in the campaign.
- Set up is shown on the Council Chambers page which represents the layout of a Council meeting
- Select a number of students to play a role:
 Mayor (elected student), Councillor x 12, public member x 2, public member audience group of 5 students.





Message from the Mayor

Activity: students to complete the activity "My Great Idea's!"

Student to cut the page from booklet and teachers to collect these to present to the Mayor on the day of his visit.



Mayor to visit your school or attend an online meeting to speak to students

Mayor visits the school

The Mayor attends the school to speak to the students about their role in the local community. Students will be given the opportunity to ask the Mayor questions.

Teacher preparation

• Ask the students to think about questions they would like to ask the Mayor prior to his visit

Mayor presents certificates

The Mayor will assist with placing the Mayoral robe on the elected student and then will present them with a certificate and gift. The remaining students who were selected by the teachers to campaign for Mayor will also be presented with a certificate. The Mayor will also present the school with Aquatopia Family Day Passes.

Teacher preparation

- Prepare selected students who participated in the Mayor campaign
- Select a student to present the Mayor with the "My Great Ideas!" student work sheets
