# **WELCOME**

This edition of the Fairfield City Museum & Gallery's program focuses on the role that memory and resilience play in art. The exhibitions MìNH, *Aftertaste* and *A Whisper Echoes Loudest* respectively explore memory and lived experiences. They explore how we see, understand, and interpret the past as a vehicle to connecting to one another.

Even though on the surface they seem disconnected to each other, all three exhibitions present fragmented stories that deal with dispossession, cultural identity, the complexity of the diaspora experience and survival strategies of marginalised people. All amazing considering, respectively they are about third generation Chinese Vietnamese people, memory, and food, and lastly about personal and intergenerational trauma.

Perfectly and beautifully counterbalancing this is an active public engagement program that speaks to and reflects our local community. The inspiration springs from the theme of our new social history exhibition that explores Fairfield City's cultural community festivals. Join us at the Latin Fest, one of our festivals during the spring-summer season. If you want to know more about your local area sign up for a tour and workshop program in September and if you have little ones in your family, take part in the annual Halloween dress up event.


# **MÌNH Community Day**
